- 1. Transdermal patch or cream
 - a. Clean area with soap & water prior to application
- 2. Math question (possibly only 2 total math in total)
- 3. Patient has a clot, does heparin dissolve the clot?
 - a. No, heparin prevents a new clot.
 - b. Thrombolytic meds destroy clots
- 4. Patient has meds by neb-cromolyn & albuterol, which do you give first?
 - a. Albuterol because it opens airway & facilitates the administration of cromolyn
- 5. Anticoagulants, why is patient on heparin and warfarin at same time?
 - a. Warfarin takes longer to reach therapeutic levels
- 6. Patient has asthma and is taking inhaled corticosteroid, they are to rinse mouth afterwards to avoid overgrowth or fungal elements within mouth
- 7. Giving medications in suspension form, you must ALWAYS shake the bottle before drawing up the medication
- 8. Epoetin stimulates RBC production
 - a. Renal patients must be told to take in more iron
- 9. Concept of tolerance-requiring larger dose of medication to obtain therapeutic effect
 - a. Usually with opioids but can be with nitro as well
- 10. Prednisone-treated for asthma
 - a. Never immediately stop the treatment, it causes adrenocortical insufficiency
- 11. Neuromuscular blocking agents-pancuronium
 - a. Suppresses respiratory effort, given to vent patients
- 12. Dry mouth due to medications
 - a. Chew on sugarless gum or suck on sugarless candies
- 13. Disulfiram-used to treat alcohol issues
 - a. Cannot drink 3-4 days after treatment
 - b. Causes nausea & vomiting
- 14. Emphysema
 - a. Prescribed theophylline- stimulates cardiac system
 - i. Need to avoid caffeine during treatment
- 15. Diagnosed with seizure disorder
 - a. Rare to be taken off medications without experiencing seizures
 - b. Life-long medications-Dilatin
 - i. Need to educate patient that it may be life long
- 16. Iron supplement-ferrous sulfate
 - a. Monitor children as it looks like candy
 - b. Should be taken between meals-absorbed better on empty stomach
- 17. Epoetin Alfa (Epogen)
 - a. Monitor Hemocrit levels to see if medication is working
- 18. Warfarin
 - a. Draw PT/INR to determine therapeutic levels of medication
- 19. Ferrous Sulfate
 - a. Liquid form-tell patient to take with orange juice, the acid aids in ingestion
- 20. Lithium-bipolar disorder (manic phase)
