
There various items that need to be included in APN E-Portfolio platform. These ranges from personal details, education details, and working information. Such include the full names and contacts, education information, certification and licensure information, organizational information, clinical positions, Leadership roles, resumes, experience, and copies of evaluations. Besides, as discussed by Dening et al. (2018), APN Portfolio should also include leadership roles, references information, research and quality improvements, and relative recommendation letters.



There are various key items that I would include in my E-Portfolio as a graduate nursing students. They would range from personal details, academic achievements, to working experiences. I would include; full names and contacts, background of my education, information on my licensure and certification, my resumes, references, transcripts, clinical work experiences, my volunteer work, copies of evaluation, and all relevant recommendation letters (Abuzaid et al., 2017).



There are various challenges that are associated with the use of E-Portfolio. First, technical challenges arises when making IT supports, system accessibility, and interoperability of the system. Secondly, resource challenges arises due to lack of adequate time to support the system, inadequate technical staff support, and inadequate maintenance cost to the system. Lastly, ethical and legal challenges arises when there are issue with data protection, intellectual protection rights, and accessibility.
