It is the responsibility of the nursing executive to ensure that each patient receives care that is focused on their needs and is of high value. To improve nursing as a profession, it is essential to provide nurses the tools they need to make contributions that matter and help drive care that is based on evidence. A future executive leader should strive to promote high quality care and outstanding nursing practice. It is essential to improve nurses' professional practice to provide them the tools they need to make contributions that support evidence-based quality care. A supportive environment not only boosts the efficiency of the providers, but also improves the quality of care supplied, patient outcomes, and the overall effectiveness of health care. Nurse executives have a voice in tough organizational decisions. I want to utilize my newly knowledge and experience to identify and address healthcare quality issues. The position of a nursing executive plays a crucial part in any healthcare system. We have studied this position in detail and learned about the many elements that play a part in shaping it. Principles of relationship building and coaching/ mentoring are concepts covered in the certification exam that align with the course material. With better communication skills, I could network, allowing me to learn from and teach others. Leadership-wise, I gained knowledge on how to implement various leadership approaches and how to direct employees. This course's lessons emphasized the knowledge and abilities necessary for nurse leaders to formulate and implement policies and procedures for the nursing profession.
