Required information regarding target audience:

The target audience for this lesson plan is associate degree nursing students in their first year.

Barriers to learning that may be present include preconceptions or misinformation related to the topic, classroom disruptions, and anxiety related to the topic. Misinformation or preconception related to the topic could affect the teaching/learning process due to the difficulty of differentiating between accurate information obtained in the classroom and prior knowledge.
