- 2. The process of DSM-5 differential diagnosis can be broken down into six basic steps:
 - 1. ruling out malingering and factitious Disorder
 - 2. ruling out a substance etiology
 - 3. ruling out an etiological medical condition
 - 4. determining the specific primary disorder(s)
 - 5. differentiating Adjustment Disorder from the residual Other Specified and Unspecified conditions, and
 - 6. establishing the boundary with no mental disorder
- 3. Ruling out a general medical etiology is one of the most important and difficult distinctions in psychiatric diagnosis. 4.See Boland table 1-23 Drugs of abuse that can be detected in urine.
