1. What schedule is Vicodin?
Answer: Schedule 2
2. What is the typical starting dose of amlodipine?
Answer: 5mg po daily
3. What is the typical dose of codeine?
Answer: 15 mg
4. What is the typical dose of alendronate?
Answer: 5mg
5. How many milligrams are colchicine tabs?
Answer: 0.6 mg
6. What is the typical dosage of Lortab?
Answer: 5/325 mg po
7. What is the typical starting dose of Lisinopril?
Answer: 10 mg po daily
8. What is the typical starting dose of Losartan?
Answer: 25-50mg po daily
9. What are the treatments for osteoarthritis?
Answer: NSAIDs & COX2 Inhibitors
10. First choice drug for acute gout?
Answer: NSAIDS or colchicine
11. For patients with hepatic and renal impairment, what medications are contraindicated with colchicine?
Answer: Cyclosporine, ranolazine, Ketoconazole, Clarithromycin, HIV Protease Inhibitors
12. What are some possible adverse effects of Colchicine?
Answer: N/V/D & Bone marrow suppression
13. What are some potential adverse effects of allopurinol?
Answer: N/V/D, neuro effects & cataracts
14. What gout medications require dosage adjustments based on renal and hepatic insufficiency?
Answer: Colchicine & Allopurinol
15. What medications are typically co-administered with gout treatments?
Answer: NSAIDS & Prednisone
16. What are some complications of untreated gout?
Answer: Tophi may form in joints & urate crystal deposits may cause renal damage
17. All the following are treatments for osteoporosis except?
Answer: Vitamin D and calcium (they are preventative)
