Discuss how geopolitical and phenomenological place influence the context of a population or community assessment and intervention. Describe how the nursing process is utilized to assist in identifying health issues (local or global in nature) and in creating an appropriate intervention, including screenings, referrals, resources and spiritual support for the community or population. Describe how community resources can aid in the implementation process of an intervention. How could the Christian worldview influence one's perspective of human value and dignity in an intervention?

A geopolitical place consists of community boundaries, transportation infrastructure, geographic features, climate, vegetation, animals, and human-made homes and facilities and a phenomenological place is a relational or psychological location rather than a geographical location centers on history, culture, economics, education, spiritual beliefs, values, common characteristics, or similar goals according to Green, S. Z. (2018). Geopolitical and phenomenological place influences the community assessment and intervention by aiding in the development of geographical, political, and psychosocial context that guides population assessment. "A community assessment involves researching the safety and quality aspects of a community to understand the interactions among the population, environment, and resources," Green, S. Z. (2018). Then, the community data from different resources measure behaviors and health status of the population. The nursing process is utilized based on the findings from the resources and the nurse identifies needs, priority outcomes, a plan, intervention, and a means to evaluate the intervention outcomes according to Green, S. Z. (2018).

The community becomes the nurse's client, which is a group of people who interact and participate in the health and wellness of the community at large. Nurses conduct an assessment of the community by using the nursing process, and thereby identifying and analyzing the problem areas, health disparities, and resources for a population. This provides insight into the conditions in which the population lives, works, and plays. By working with community stakeholders, which includes spiritual groups, the nurse can make a difference in the health of larger groups. (Green, S. Z., 2018).

The implementation process of interventions in the community may be by using mass media or other approaches, or may take place within community institutions, such as neighborhoods, schools, churches, work sites, voluntary agencies, or other organizations. Different levels of intervention may be employed, including educational or other strategies that involve individuals, families, social networks, organizations, and public policy. These community-based interventions may also engage community input through advisory committees or community coalitions that assist in tailoring interventions to specific target groups or to adapt programs to community characteristics and the focus of this is primarily on changing individuals' behaviors as a method for reducing the population's risk of diseases.

The Christian worldview influence on one's perspective of human value and dignity comes from the Bible which says that "the value and dignity of human life is derived from God the Creator and is rooted in the fact that all humans have been created in God's image". "As stewards of the life God has given, we are to
