Outline the process for the development of nursing standards of practice for your state, including discussion of the entities involved in developing the standards of practice and how the standards of practice influence the nursing process for your areas of specialty.

Answer:

The nursing standards of practice in California is implemented by the board of registered nursing. The board of registered nursing develop and implement a group of Laws called the Nursing Practice Act which is related to nursing education, licensing, practice, and discipline.

"The Nursing Practice Act (NPA) is the body of California law that mandates the Board to set out the scope of practice and responsibilities for RNs. The NPA is located in the California Business and Professions Code starting with Section 2700. Regulations which specify the implementation of the law appear in the California Code of Regulations. The NPA is updated annually and is published by LexisNexis in conjunction with the Board ", (California Board of Registered Nursing).

A group of nine members makes up the decision-making body of the board of registered nursing. Two of the board members are appointed by the Governor, and the Legislature sets the other two. The group of nine is a mix of four members of the public and five registered
