CNSs are also involved in matters of community and	Nurse Educators are the gatekeepers of the nurses in practice ethical codes of conduct for both nurses and nursing students in practice. The Nurse Educator's specific duty mandates that they ensure that both the students and nurses uphold the ethical standards and codes in their practice (DeNizco & Baker, 2014). The Nurse Educator makes decisions, teaches and directs students and nurses on *evidence-based practices for inspiration and the implementation of all codes of conduct across	Similarities: Both are custodians of the Nurses Code of Conduct in the practice and education of nursing. Both inspire and guide the actual application of these standards in all situations. Differences: Nurse Educators are limited to the classroom setting whereas the Clinical Nurse Specialist applies the adoption of the ethical standards both at community level and practice level.
